

Free Subject and Predicate Worksheet — Grade 3 to 5



Quick Guide for Students & Teachers

Subject: The 'Who' or 'What' the sentence is about. (Noun/Pronoun).

Predicate: What the subject 'Does' or 'Is'. (Action/Verb part).

Example: The happy dog (Subject - Who?) | chased the ball (Predicate - Did what?).



Part 1: Identify the Subject

Underline the subject. Ask: "Who or what is this sentence about?"

1. The giant oak tree fell during the storm.
2. My best friend creates amazing drawings.
3. Jupiter is the largest planet in our solar system.
4. The tired runner stopped to drink water.
5. A swarm of bees chased the bear.



Part 2: Circle the Predicate

Circle the predicate. Ask: "What does the subject do or what is it?"

1. The astronauts landed on the moon.
2. My phone ran out of battery.
3. The little puppy chewed on his new toy.
4. Sarah and John are going to the library.
5. Heavy rain caused a flood in the city.



Part 3: Match the Subject with the Predicate

Draw a line to connect the subject with its correct action (predicate).
